


The above view is 40 acres between Center St. on the left (past the donkeys), and looking toward the Highgrove Elementary School. Spring St. is shown on the far right of the photo.

### SAVE THE TRUJILLO ADOBE!



The Trujillo Adobe was built n 1862 by the sons of La Placita de los Trujillos and is on the list of the National Trust for Historic Pre servation that named the Trujillo Adobe building as one of the nations 11 most endangered historic places due to the extensive decay. I took the above photo on March 31, 2018 that was in our May 2018 issue and I took the inside photo on July 10, 2021.





The Trujillo Adobe building is located on the N/W corner of Center St. and Orange Street. Another protective building covers the original but inside access is limited.

The top portion of the Highgrove Town Center is 40 acres between Center St. and Spring St. and the upper corner shown by the arrow is 8 acres that are planned for a future grocery store and related businesses.

The other arrow shown on the right is where the un-used dirt road could be located for a new North South road between Main St. and Spring St. Palmyrita Avenue.

The bottom portion of the map shown on the right is from south of Spring St. all the way to the arroyo which is the southern boundary of the Highgrove Town Center project.



### Extending Spring St. from "HERE" TO





# WILL ALLOW A NEW ROAD SO VEHICLES CAN ACCESS THE IOWA OVERPASS WHEN TRAINS BLOCK MAIN ST. AND CENTER STREETS

The photo above is where Spring St. dead ends at Transit Avenue. There are no obstructions that have to be removed because this property is vacant where an extention of Spring St. could be a new way to get to the Iowa Overpass. The above view is looking **west** from Spring St. and Transit Avenue.

The bottom two photos show where Spring St. could go into 17.22 acres of vacant land that is already owned by the Riverside County Transportation Commission.

RCTC has labeled this property an "UNECONOMIC REM-NANT" but this property is needed so Spring St. can be extended to the Iowa Ave. Overpass to prevent traffic jams on Center and Main.





A new road and Metrolink Station is needed here!





Spring St. could go through RCTC's field on the left and then connect to this abandoned paved road that has not been used since 2008. This road has a sidewalk and street lighting that was required when the warehouses were built along Citrus St. but this road has been blocked off for 13 years by a gate at the far end of the top photo. It is time to connect Spring St. to this road and unlock the gate so vehicles can get to the existing Iowa Ave. Overpass!



This is the other end (south end) of the abandoned paved road near Citrus St. that has been **locked and never used.** To see how this unlocked gate could connect to the Iowa Ave Overpass, turn to P. 4

This Metrolink train is going past RCTC's 17 acre field where a station is needed. The arrow points to Citrus St. that connects to the Iowa Ave. Overpass. The other end of this road leads to the paved/abandoned road that has been locked for 13 years that is shown in the 2 right hand photos on page 3.



To get to the Iowa Ave. Overpass, two railroad grade crossings would have to be built over the Perris Valley Line track that is a branch line with no Metrolink service on week ends.

But building two grade crossings is a lot cheaper and can be done a lot sooner than waiting for an Overpass or Underpass to be built on Center St. which would affect Historical structures and businesses. The latest information about the cost of an underpass was explained in the Press Enterprise on July 5, 2021 that shows that an underpass at Jurupa Road will cost \$133.4 million dollars. How many grade crossings can you build for that amount? The two grade crossings that are needed are not on the BNSF or UP main lines but are on the seldom used Perris Valley Line branch line that has no Metrolink service on week-ends. RCTC is the county agency in charge of transportation and two new roads and a Metrolink Station at Highgrove should not be opposed by our county transportation agency because now more than ever, Highgrove has the rooftops to warrant building two more roads and a Metrolink Station.

The Riverside County Planning Department Stated That: "NO PUBLIC HEARING will be held on the Highgrove Town Center unless written requests are received by June 18, 2021." But at least 4 requests for a public hearing were sent before the deadline and here is the response I received on June 28, 2021 from the Riverside County Planning Department about a Public Hearing or an Environmental Impact Study: "No addditional envronmental review is required for this permitted use."

Looking South from Center Street, this abandoned railroad property is an unused dirt road called "California Street".

There are only two North/South streets that go all the way through Highgrove between Main St. and Palmyrita Avenue.

They are Iowa Ave. and Mt. Vernon Avenue.

Many other N/S streets do not go all the way through including Cindy Circle, Heron, Garfield, Prospect, Transit, Highland, Pacific, Commercial, Browning, Mandarin, Whipporwill, Murphy, Pelican, Walker, Elena, Swayzee, Keone, Carlin, and Sanrive.

But the opportunity to make another North/South street all the way through Highgrove is to use the property owned by the Union Pacific railroad that has abandoned their right-of-way and removed the railroad track.

In last month's issue we had extenive photos showing how this property is no longer needed for trains and how the adjacent dirt road that parallels the former track, has also been abandoned. The railroad's right-of-way could be graded for a useable two way road between Main St. and Palmyrita to relieve our traffic issues.




This is "California Street" looking south from Spring Street.

# The "HG" logo on the left does not stand for Highgrove but what does it stand for and how is it connected to Highgrove?

For many years I have heard about Home Gardens but I had never been there until recently.

I looked it up on the map and drove to Home Gardens which is along Magnolia Ave. by Corona and I visited the Library and the local Academy.

I talked to the librian, took a few pictures and met a long time resident who wanted to talk my leg off about Home Gardens.

I knew that Home Gardens is also an un-incorporated of Riverrside County just like Highgrove's CSA 126.

But what I didn't know was that And for 30 years each Highgrove Home Gardens does not have a CSA (County Service Area) number like Highgrove, they have no MAC, and they do not hold community meetings like Highgrove does.

By going on-line I also learned that Home Gardens is only 1.6 sq. miles compared to Highgrove's 3.2 sq miiles but they have more density. I also learned a lot of things from him.

about their sheriff protection.

For a long time I have heard that there is a Deputy Sheriff's beat whose job is to cover calls from both Highgrove and Home Gardens. When a call comes from Highgrove and the deputy is in Home Gardens, it is about 16 miles or a 30 minute drive depending on traffic for this deputy to come from Home Gardens to Highgrove.

So how is this connected to Highgrove?

It has been 30 years since Highgrove became the first un-incorporated community in Riverside County to have its own Sheriff Deputy assigned exclusively to the Highgrove community.








#### Things You Should Know About Metrolink

This old Jan. 4, 2012 photo shows where existing Metrolink trains could stop at Highgrove. But for the last 20 years, RCTC has refused to build a Metrolink station at Highgrove. There is ample room for parking and RCTC already owns the 17 acre field. All the existing daily trains need to do is stop here for passengers! Metrolink trains on the IEOC (Inland Empire Orange County) line have gone right through Highgrove since March 4, 1996.

In July 2006, the Orange County Transportation Authority created weekend service on the IEOC.

On July 2016, eight Metrolink trains in each direction went between San Bernardino and Oceanside.

**Currently**, on Monday thru Friday there are Four Metrolink trains in each direction that go through Highgrove without stopping between San Bernardino, Riverside, and Oceanside.

And currently, on Saturday and Sunday there are two Metrolink trains in each direction that go through Highgrove without stopping between San Bernardino, Riverside. and Oceanside.

For 20 years residents from Highgrove and Grand Terrace have requested that a Metrolink station be built on the vacant property right next to the track that the Metrolink trains use.


The Riverside County Transportation Commission owns 17.22 acres of vacant land right next to the track but for 20 years they have refused to build a parking lot and station at Highgrove. From Highgrove it is 7 rail miles to San Bernardino and 3 1/2 rail miles in the other direction to Riverside and a station at Highgrove will not interfere with the Perris Valley Line Metrolink trains because they have different destinations.

The grading for the Metrolink parking lot could be done when Spring St. is extended to connect to the Iowa Ave. overpass.

20 years later we now have the rooftops and a Metrolink station at Highgrove is needed now more than ever on the vacant land that RCTC owns that is just growing weeds!

#### "California Street"



The raised portion on the right is the former UP railroad track that has been abandoned but "California Street" could go through this area where this unused railroad track and impassible dirt road could go through to connect to Palmyrita Ave. in the distance.





There are two existing culverts to handle water run off that goes under "California St." and the former railroad track.

This area has attracted illegal dumping for many years and used tires have again been dumped in this area. To see how this same area looked before the county cleaned it up in January 2020, go to page 10 and see the boat and Jet Ski that were illegally dumped.

Kerry Strug, an Olympic gymnast in the 1996 as a member of the "Magnificent Seven", the team of young women who won the first ever Team Gold Medal for the US Gymnastics Team, is notable for having a vault landing that badly sprained her ankle and then she returned to the vault to take her 2nd turn, stick the landing on a seriously injured and very painful ankle to cinch the Gold Medal for Team USA. What was memorable for her, she shared many years later, was the embarrassment of being carried to the medal podium and being the only athlete there in her skimpy leotard and not in her athletic pants like her teammates. She was very self-conscious and uncomfortable. That occurred 24 years ago.

Women athletes are still uncomfortable, feeling vulnerable, and at times horribly sexualized; being directed as to what they WILL wear when competing. The rules are rarely proportional for women as for men. Adding more confusion is there are conflicting rules depending on the sport and the country. Women have been fined for their uniforms being too long. In others, the uniforms have been too short. Here are some recent and remarkable examples.

In June of this year, Olivia Breen, 24, a double Paralympic world champion for the United Kingdom, said she was stunned after a sporting official said her sprint briefs were "too short and inappropriate" at a recent competition. She said she has been wearing the same style of shorts for almost a decade and that up until now, it had never been an issue. These are the same shorts she wore when she won a bronze medal at the London 2012 Paralympics but now an official pulled her aside and told her the shorts were "too short and inappropriate; they are too revealing" and that she should "consider buying some (longer) shorts." She was shocked beyond belief. She said "women should not be made to feel self conscious about what they are wearing when competing." Twitter had a field day: "We should be celebrating women's sporting excellence, not limiting them to the size of their knickers," read one tweet.

In contrast- these women athletes were FINED for NOT wearing a super skimpy bottom. (continued top right)

Norway's beach handball players were each fined 150 euros (about \$177) for wearing shorts rather than the required bikini bottoms during their match the weekend of July 17-18. A spokeswoman for the International Handball Federation said she didn't know the reason for the very skimpy bikini bottom rule. The International Handball Federation requires women to wear bikini bottoms "with a close fit and cut on an upward angle toward the top of the leg." The sides of the bikini bottoms must be no more than four inches. Men, on the other hand, can wear shorts as long as four inches above their knees as long as they are "not too baggy." "I don't see why we can't play in shorts," said Martine Welfler, one of the Norwegian players. "With so much body shaming and stuff like that these days, you should be able to wear a little bit more when you play." Norway has repeatedly complained about the bikini bottom requirement to the international federation since 2006. "Nothing has happened," he said. (NYT 07-20-21)

In 2011, the Badminton World Federation decreed that women must wear skirts or dresses to play at the elite level to create a more "attractive presentation" when in actuality it is to "help revive flagging interest in women's badminton". Or women's bottoms?

Janice Forsyth, an associate professor of sociology at Western University in Canada and a former director of the university's International Center for Olympic Studies: "To say that wearing less clothing, as the women are required to do, allows them to be better athletes is just silly. I don't see how that argument holds any weight."

Three members of the German women's team at the European Artistic Gymnastics Championships in Switzerland recently gained attention for their outfits. Unlike their peers, their legs were covered. They wore full-body unitards; most women typically wear leotards that show the entire leg but have long sleeves. Male gymnasts, however, usually wear either slightly loose shorts or full-length leg coverings. Unitards are technically permitted but usually are worn for religious reasons. It was a statement "against sexualization in gymnastics," the German Gymnastics Federation said. Elisabeth Seitz, one of the gymnasts, said it was "to set an example ... to all gymnasts who may feel uncomfortable or even sexualized in normal suits.




Lenny had an uncanny ability to find happiness in his daily life. His family and friends meant everything to him and he cherrished every moment with them.
