

Reinvesting Dividends Can Pay Off

When you invest in stocks, you want their price to go up. But of course, you can't control the rise and fall of stock prices. However, there is a key element of investing that you can control — the number of shares you own. And in the long run, share ownership may be more important than rising stock prices in determining your long-term investment success.

Of course, you might think that the advice of "buy more shares" is easier said than done. After all, not everyone can easily find a lot of extra money to invest. But you don't need access to vast wealth to increase your share ownership — you just need to consistently reinvest your stock dividends.

Just how important are reinvested dividends to wealth accumulation, as compared to capital gains (the increase in stock prices)? Over the 135-year period from 1871 through 2003, owning stocks and reinvesting the dividends produced 97% of all stock market returns, with only 3% coming from capital gains, according to a major study done by Dr. Jeremy Siegel, one of the world's leading researchers on stock market performance. Other studies have also pointed to the importance of dividends as a component of total returns.

What are the implications of this disparity between the effectiveness of dividend reinvestment versus that of capital gains? First of all, it suggests that you may not want to spend an undue amount of time and effort in chasing after "hot" stocks, hoping for big capital gains. For one thing, by the time you buy these stocks, they may already be cooling off, but even more importantly, your focus on achieving large capital gains may not be the best use of your financial resources.

Ultimately, the power of dividend reinvestment means, not surprisingly, that you may be able to help yourself if you look for quality

#### Riverside Highland Water Company Restricts Water Use!

At the July 24, 2014 Riverside Highland Water Company Board meeting, the Board of Directors approved Stage 2 of the Company's Water Shortage Contingency Plan. The adoption of this plan is the result of a three year drought and a statewide directive to restrict water



use for all Californians. Well No. 22 is located on Spring St. These restrictions include: washing down driveways and sidewalks; watering of outdoor landscapes that cause excess runoff; using a hose to wash a motor vehicle, unless the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle, and using potable water in a fountain or decorative water feature, unless the water is recirculated. In addition to the State mandated restrictions, the Company is also requesting other water conservation measures: water served in restaurants will be by request only and the Company is requesting our customers to reduce outside watering to no more than four days per week and only between the hours of 6 p.m. to 8 a.m.

At the current time, we are requesting voluntary water conservation. The Company will not be issuing fines, but will work with our customers through verbal communication as well as hang tags when we observe noncompliance. However, if the Community does not respond to conservation or if the State requires additional cutbacks, we may be forced to issue fines in the future. Our goal is to pull together as a community to conserve water. We at Riverside Highland Water Company believe that through education and communication, our customers will understand the seriousness of the situation and come together to save water for the benefit of our community's future.



#### Made in the USA

Buying American isn't easy. Just about everything we purchase these days was made elsewhere. I think we all believe it's best to buy products made in the U.S., but it's not always an easy thing to do. Made in China is the most common label we see now days. Even though the U.S. invented and pioneered most every electronics devise, the actual manufacture of these products is overseas. There are no televisions made in the US any more, Zenith was the last, selling to South Korea owned Goldstar in 1995.

There are many American companies that design and sell electronics, but none that I can find that are manufactured here. Apple, Hewett Packard, Motorola, Dell, all designed and marketed here, but manufactured in China for the most part.

Aerospace products like Boeing, Lockheed Martin, Gulfstream, and such are made in the U.S., but most consumers aren't in the market for a 20 million dollar aircraft.

Construction and home building is still something we can't import. I'm waiting for the next shoe to drop. That will be when the Chinese build modular homes to export to the U.S.

Whose fault is this turn of events? Well, it's us. Workers here demand a higher wage, making our products more expensive. We buy the foreign products to save a buck, and shortly the

competing products made domestically loose market share, and go under.

I'm a member of a union, so I'm not going to bash unions. But, paying a worker \$45. per hour plus benefits amounting to \$75., to put the left front fender on a Chevy, and calling that skilled labor is crazy. It's math like that that has made Detroit a ghost town

U.S automakers apparently have seen the light. American autos are now at least on par with foreign autos. Now the most made in the U.S. auto is the Ford F-150. Also in the top 10 are the Corvette Stingray, and the Dodge Viper. There are several foreign cars assembled in the U.S, but guess where the profits go?

Cars are unlike other industries since they consume parts from virtually every other industry. Auto manufacturing consumes more steel, aluminum, rubber, plastic, chromium, electronics, and electrical than any other industry. They consume vast amounts of glass, carpet, upholstery, gases and composites

When we buy foreign products, we need to consider our 401K, our stock portfolio, our retirement, and our pension. Simply put, it it's good for China, It's not good for us.

dividend-paying stocks — and then reinvest the dividends, month after month and year after year.

With just a little research, you can find stocks that have paid - and even increased — dividends for many years in a row. Leasing to the wrong tenants left this property a mess in Highgrove!





The above mess was left by the former tenant on the north east corner of Center St. and Iowa Avenue. This corner property was upgraded by the Riverside County Economic Development Agency in their Facade program that made improvements such as new stucco, illuminated business sign and wrought iron fencing on the entire corner. When "Fix It Right" folded they left hundreds of tires on the property that was visible from our main intersection at Center St. and Iowa Avenue. The tires were removed from the parking lot on Nov. 16, 2013 at no cost to the property owner.

The next tenant to move into the "Fix It Right" location packed the parking lot with disabled junk cars that resembled a Pick-A-Part junk yard. The entire parking lot was full of disabled vehicles that were brought in by tow trucks and dismantled car parts were all over the ground causing concern that this property was not being used as an auto repair facility. In the March 2014 issue of the Highgrove Happenings we ran photos showing the disabled junk cars. Then on March 26, 2014 a letter was sent by the entire 7 members of the Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council about this junk yard being located near the beautiful exit of the I-215 northbound freeway at Center Street.

The letter states: We have a beautiful "Welcome to Highgrove" sign at the I-215 freeway exit but this intersection is a bad "first impression" of our community". The letter was addressed to the Riverside County Supervisors, Riverside County Code Enforcement, Riverside County Hazardous Waste Management, Riverside County Sheriff's Department, California Highway Patrol and the Highgrove Fire Department.

Just recently, the junk cars were all taken away and the parking lot appeared to be vacant. But when the landlord opened the garage doors he was

faced with a whole new problem because the trash had been placed inside the building. On July 23, 2014 I met with the property owner but he



# 20 Police cars head them off at Pigeon Pass! Riverside City Police and Riverside County Sheriff invade Pigeon Pass to block escape route from fatal Moreno Valley shootings



On July 22, 2014 Jim Jaurigue from Toy Tech called me about all the police cars at the entrance of Spring Mountain Ranch at Mt. Vernon Ave. and Pigeon Pass Road. When I arrived the road was blocked off and at this time I did not know the

reason why.

I didn't want to interfere so I stayed on the sidelines. Earlier that same morning I had been up in the Spring Mountain Ranch area taking pictures for the Highgrove Happenings Newspaper.



The Police cars had already gone up Pigeon Pass when the channel 4 news van was not allowed to enter and had to turn around and go to Moreno Valley. I talked to Steve Shin briefly and later saw

him on TV when he gave his report in Moreno Valley. There were several TV helicopters and Sheriff helicopters looking for the suspect and ground units that included the SWAT team.



Shortly after I arrived, about 20 Riverside City Police cars with sirens and lights on came from Palmyrita Ave. across Mt. Vernon Ave. and went in between the parked police cars and raced up the newly paved Pigeon Pass Road at the entrance of

Spring Mountain Ranch. I did not know what was happening at the time but I knew it was something major because I have never seen so many cop cars in my life! When an "Officer Down" is broadcast there is a full response by law officers!



This view is hard to actually see but there are 10 unmarked cars and police cars in this picture because they blend in with the newly paved part of Pigeon Pass Road. I took these photos from the north /west corner of Mt. Vernon Ave. and

On Tuesday, July 22, 2014, at approximately 2:24 pm, officers from the Moreno Valley Police Department responded to the area of Sunnymead Ranch Parkway and Old Lake regarding a report of a shooting. Officers immediately arrived and confirmed a homicide had occurred. With assistance from the city-wide camera system officers spotted the suspect vehicle fleeing the area north on Pigeon Pass.

A motor officer was in the area and observed the suspect vehicle abandoned. At that time the motor officer asked for assistance and observed an adult male walking northbound on Pigeon Pass in close proximity to the vehicle. Another Moreno Valley officer attempted to contact the suspect at which time the suspect opened fire on the officer with an assault rifle and an officer involved shooting occurred.

During the shooting the officer was injured and an "officer down" call was broadcast. Multiple law enforcement agencies responded. The officer involved in the shooting was removed from the scene and transported to a local hospital with minor injuries.

The multi-agency response, which included the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and Riverside Police Department SWAT Teams, assisted with the search of the suspect.

At approximately 3:54 pm, officers from the Moreno Valley Police Department responded to the 25000 block of Delphinium Avenue regarding a suspicious circumstance. Upon their arrival, responding officers discovered a deceased male inside of the residence. Further investigation revealed he was a victim of a homicide and it is believed to be connected to both the

homicide at the Shell Station and Station the officer involved shooting.

Because the armed suspect was Perris Station still outstanding, several streets in Professional Standards Bureau geon Pass were closed to the public and residents were encouraged to Special Enforcement Bureau stay in their homes. Tactical officers cleared the area north of the Outside Agencies: affected housing development and American Medical Rescue residents were allowed to return.

# California Dreaming

Being a transplanted native Californian I am suffering from shock just like my plants. I miss Highgrove and all my family and friends! I moved to central Oregon three years ago and it is nothing like Highgrove. I knew the change would be dramatic- this little city has about 80,000 people, hundreds, if not thousands, of wild deer, and more dogs per capita that any place I've ever been. It's another planet compared to California. Let me share with you my journey.

I've written before how gardening in this area is tough. As a Master Gardner (certified several years ago through UCR program) it is very frustrating. I feel like I'm back in first grade. Highgrove is in Sunset Plant Zone 19. Bend, Oregon is in Zone 1. ONE! As a rule, we don't plant until the first week of June or later, as that is when we are fairly confident there will be no freezing. This year I planted seeds for lettuce mix and radishes, garlic sets and seed potatoes. By the first of July all the greens were up about two inches. Then the heat rolled in; we had temperatures in the 90's practically overnight. My radishes and lettuce mix bolted. That means they became plants with flower buds. So now I have a nice patch of green and blooms; no salad. I still have potatoes and garlic growing. There is hope for some success in Zone One.

When summer comes to Bend there is an explosion of outdoor activities. Concerts in the park two or three times a week with bands and singers coming from all over; Ringo Starr was here a couple of weeks ago. Pat Benatar will be at the Deschutes County Fair and the headliners will keep rolling in until Labor Day. Every weekend there is a run for something fun or to support a cause. Bicycling is also a huge sport here. Large event bike races like the "Tour de Chutes" are held every year. The Tour de Chutes is comparable to the Tour de Terrace. This year a run was also incorporated. Racers come from all over the country for this one.

"Balloons Over Bend" is an annual event as well when hot air balloons are set up for a three-day festi-

val. Friday nights are exciting; the balloons are lighted up and coordinated with music. The balloons shoot flames up and the crowd goes wild. Dawn on Saturday morning the balloons launch and float over the river and into the valley. It is a lovely sight.

Beer, as I've told you, is a big deal here. We now have over 30 micro-breweries. All are very successful and many can't keep up with the demand. We celebrate beer in a big way. "Bend Brew Fest" is held every August. (You still have time to make your travel plans) One can enter the tasting area and for a nominal fee, sample brews from a few dozen breweries. The brewers get to try their new recipes on this discerning crowd. It also gives participants a chance to taste brews that are new to us and maybe find a new favorite. With beer there is also food.

Bend has a large army of food trucks and trailers that are stationed around town. Staying open yearround, weathering the snow and freezing temperatures, they have loyal customers who enjoy their products. These eateries are not your usual rolling food trucks. One close to downtown opens at 6 pm and stays until midnight making-DONUTS. The line is long and he usually sells out. Other dining opportunities include Chinese dumplings, Thai, German, Hawaiian, fish & chips, and of course, tacos, soup and sandwiches. All are frequently inspected by the fire department for safety (no exploding propane tanks here) and by the health department for food safety. Some have done so well as a portable restaurant they have opened regular restaurants. It's a great way to have some seriously good food on the go. .

I remember being very smug in January and February, gloating about how I could wear a sweater and sit in the sun. My comeuppance always came in the summer. The cold weather will be here in less than two months. Now I look forward to summer. You can look forward to winter.






