At a celebration in downtown Riverside on Oct. 29, 2019, Dr.Farooq was recognized by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors, the Regional Economic Development Agencies, and the University of California at Riverside for his appointment as Chairman of the California Workforce Development Board.

New Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council members selected

On October 30, 2019 there was a meeting held at the Highgrove Library by Supervisor Spiegel's staff to announce the selection of the new Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council.

to send us a press release about restoring the Highgrove MAC did not receive any response from Supervisor's Spiegel or her office.

Last April, on April 10, 2019,

only 3 members in the audience from the old part of Highgrove and 2 others who were also from Spring Mountain Ranch. I learned about the meeting from a friend of mine who also lives in at least 2 members from the original part of Highgrove who applied for a seat on the new MAC but were not selected.

If you have been following our newspaper you know that before Supervisor Tavaglione eliminating the original Highgrove MAC, I resigned from the MAC before the public hearing and asked Supervisor Tavaglione to continue to allow the MAC to hold monthly meetings without me. The Oct. 30, 2019 MAC meeting was the first Highgrove MAC meeting in the library for over 2 years. Prior to the Oct. 30th meeting the last time a previous MAC meeting was held was on November 16, 2016 when the previous Highgrove MAC sent 27 questions to Riverside County Cont. on P. 3

The meeting was conducted I sent an e-mail to Supervisor by Wendall Bugtai, Land Use Policy Advisor for Supervisor Spiegel but Supervisor Spiegel did not attend.

All seven of the new members, (the 5 members and 2 alternate members. of the Highgrove MAC) were selected from the Spring Mountain Ranch area of Highgrove. No one from the original part of Highgrove was selected.

You did not see this October 30, 2019 meeting advertised in the Highgrove Happenings Newspaper because many requests to the supervisor's office

Spiegel asking for a press release about the Highgrove MAC so it could be published in the May issue. I did not receive a response and I have not received any responses from any of the other 13 e-mails I sent to her as far back as March 4, 2019.

Prior to her being elected, on July 16, 2018 she came to Highgrove and I showed her around our community for 2 hours but I have not been able to communicate with her since she took office on Jan. 8, 2019. At the new MAC meeting on October 30, 2019 there were

Spring Mountain Ranch.

During this meeting the question came up about all 7 members being selected from Spring Mountain Ranch while no one was selected from the original part of Highgrove.

Mr. Bugtai, host of the meeting, stated that no applications were received from the original part of Highgrove but corrected himself when one of the 3 members in the audience was present at the meeting, This member is from the original part of Highgrove and had applied for a position on the MAC, but was rejected. I know for a fact that there are

before obtaining legal council. Answers from Riverside County were due back on Jan. 18, 2017 but no County representatives attended the Jan., Feb. or March MAC meetings, in 2017. Then on April 11, 2017 Supervisor Tavaglione eliminated the entire Highgrove MAC in spite of requests from Highgrove residents at the public hearing for Supervisor Tavaglione to allow the Highgrove MAC to continue to hold monthly public meetings. Six months ago on June 1, 2019, I attended the Spring Mountain Ranch Park dedication where applications were available to apply for a position on the new Highgrove MAC.

But Riverside County did not send application forms to the Highgrove Happenings for publication and distribution to the rest of Highgrove.

Back on March 29, 2019 my e-mail to Supervisor Spiegel stated that our papers are home delivered to each house in Highgrove. This includes county residents west of the freeway, the orriginal part of Highgrove, the new homes in Spring Mountain Ranch, and the new D R Horton homes.

In an effort to help maintain Highgrove's identity, all of the new street signs in the new streets in Spring Mountain Ranch and the DR Horton homes have the Highgrove logo at the top of the signs.

It has always been the policy of the Highgrove Happenings to bring Highgrove closer together for one identity but this decision by the county divides our community into old and new sections.

For 28 years Highgrove has had community meetings every month except December.

Today the people from the original part of Highgrove have been bypassed and replaced by MAC members who are all from one portion of the new homes in Highgrove.

But, by the county selecting all seven members from the new portion of Highgrove while ignoring other long time residents who applied for positions on the new MAC seems unfair, in-appropriate, and politically revengful.

This certainly is not the fault of the Sprng Mountain Ranch people who applied for these positions. We welcome all of our new residents and I hope to get to know more people from our new homes. We commend you for wanting to volunteer for your community.

In addition, by the the county boycotting the only local newspaper in Highgrove is an improper injustice that prevents important information from reaching the entire Highgrove community. For 25 years our motto at the top of our papers state: "Dedicated to the improvement of our community through awareness and involvement in local issues"

But if information is intentionally witheld, we can not bring important news to the entire community.

The defendants in this case are Riverside County and if I am criticised by county management, I understand their position. But if I have uncovered something that has been done that is inappropriate or illegal that effects every property owner in

Highgrove, then I take pride if I am called a whistleblower because I blew the whistle on what the county is doing to My investigative Highgrove. reporting has exposed Riverside County and I don't blame them for being mad at me.

This battle is truly non-partisan because if you are a Democrat, Republican, or an Independant, all of Highgrove should be asking the county where our special assessment money went! And, is it improper or illegal to ISSUED! intentionally withold information by boycotting the Highgrove Oct. 30th meeting I addressed Happenings Newspaper from publishing important information about a public meeting in order to keep some of the Highgrove residents from knowing about the Highgrove MAC meetings?

When information is intentionally witheld, we can not bring you the local news that is important to you and to your community.

On November 1, 2019, I asked who made the decision to select all of the new Highgrove MAC members from Spring Mountain Ranch and I received the following reply from Wendall Bugtai:

"I'm working with our attorneys to determine what is permissable for public consumption related to the MAC applications and selection process."

The selection process should have been transparent and assesible to the public because these are public positions that should be open to all members and volunteers in our community. The selection process should not be hidden from the public!

Remember, all parcels should be paying \$120.00 per year but the Spring Mountain Ranch people are being charged almost \$3,000.00 for CSA 126 and I am standing up for you too! Check the amount across from CSA 126 on your tax bill and if it is more than \$120.00 you too should also be questioning the county.

This lawsuit was based on many things but the last 5 words in their answer to question # 22 was: NO REFUNDS WILL BE

Duriing public comments at the the new MAC members by telling them that I will help them any way I can if I am asked and I requested they go to our web site: www.highgrovehappenings.net so they can read about highgrove on-line clear back to July 2008 to learn something about the community to which they have been appointed.

But were these appointments based on punishment for Highgrove's lawsuit against Riverside County about continuing to have to pay for our own Sheriff Deputy that was eliminated 10 years ago?

On Nov. 13, 2019 I asked for a meeting with Supervisor Spiegel and on Nov. 19, 2019 I received the following reply:

"Our office does not feel it is appropriate for you to have a formal meet with Supervisor Spiegel until the ongoing litigation you have with Riverside County is resolved. "Highgrove, All of our new residents should know that four members of the Highgrove community filed a lawsuit against Riverside county on behalf of every Cont. on P. 5

What happened to the Highgrove Station Sign?



I took this picture in July of 2008. Highgrove is still a station on the railroad's timetable and we would like to have the sign replaced for historical purposes.

On October 14, 2019 I sent a request to the BNSF railroad in San Bernardino to try and get the Highgrove Station sign replaced near Main Street where it was located before it disappeared.

I sent a copy of the picture I took of the Santa Fe. Steam engine 3751 when it passed through Highgrove on May 14, 2014 that shows the station sign. Later I found the above picture that was taken 6 years earlier in July 2008. I have asked the BNSF railroad to help us replace this historic sign. I even promised to have a new sign made if the railroad would provide a post and do the installation.

the new homes in Spring Mountain Ranch, and the D R Horton homes, to find out where our CSA 126 special assessment money has gone. That special tax money was supposed to pay for a Sheriff Deputy that was assigned exclusively to Highgrove and park maintenance and if not used for these 2 spacific purposes it was to be <u>"Retained"</u> in the CSA 126 account.

Voters approved the Sheriff assessment in 1992 and 1997 by ballots mailed out by the county but no ballot was received when the sheriff was eliminated on Dec. 30, 2009. And no notice was ever sent out to the Highgrove property owners that after Dec. 30, 2009, Highgrove was going to loose it's Deputy Sheriff. But for 10 years the Highgrove property owners still have to pay for the deputy we do not have that was eliminated without proper notice to the voters.

Grand Jury investigation

There has already been a Grand Jury investigation about the funds that were collected by the special CSA 126 assessment for the Highgrove Sheriff. Here is the statement released by the Grand Jury after their investigation that I read to the Riverside County Board of Supervisors on October 16, 2018.

The following information should be the first priority for the new Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council to see that the Grand Jury's recommendations are carried out.

"Recommendations from Grand Jury to Riverside County Board of Supervisors and Riverside County Economic Development Agency.

CSA 126 Communication

CSA126 management provide a one time public notice clarifying exactly how the CSA 126 funds are distributed. this notice should include the number of parcels

CSA 126 management provide a one-time public notice clarifying exactly how the CSA 126 funds are distributed. This notice should include the number of assessed parcels, the amount per parcel for different housing areas and current agreements and contracts in effect.

At least once every 2 years, CSA management should make a summary report on line and at a public meeting open to all interested Highgrove residents. This effort is appropriate and necessary since there is no current form to discuss such issues in the Highgrove Community. Part of the summary of the contracts and agreements should explain the effective date and cost of the current chain of agreements between the CSA 126 management and the Jurupa Valley sheriff Station for focused law enforcement coverage."

Dennis Gallegos Memorial



Many people have asked me to do something about the memorial to Dennis Gallegos who was killed on September 28, 2017 when, as a pedestrian, he stepped too close to a freight train at this location. We printed an article on our web site: www.highgrovehappenings.net on page 14 of the November 2017 issue of the Highgrove Happenings Newspaper. We have asked for assistance from the BNSF railroad because this memorial is attached to the fence along Main St. that surrounds the railroad's equipment storage yard. We realize the heartache and loss that the family has gone through but after 2 years of this memorial, people keep suggesting that the family needs to move these items to their private residences.

Here is a copy of the 1997 ballot that was approved by 75.8 % of the Highgrove voters to keep our Deputy Sheriff

The following statement was an "Impartial Analysis" made by the Riverside County Council prior to the 1997 Ballot:

"This tax will be retained in the CSA 126 fund to be used only for purposes of continuing Extended Sheriff, and Park and Recreation services and improvements. This tax cannot be increased except by a 2/3 vote of the electorate"





This ballot was approved for only for two spacific purposes. If not used for these two purposes the funds were supposed to be **"Retained"** in Highgrove's CSA 126 account!

Highgrove was doing fine until Riverside County did this:

* After 17 years, eliminated the Highgrove Sheriff without notifying the Highgrove voters who voted to pay extra for their own sheriff.

* Required Highgrove voters to continue to pay for the sheriff that they eliminated 10 years ago on Dec. 30, 2009.

* Eliminated the Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council on April 11, 2017 because Highgrove was asking too many questions about our finances.

* Increased the annual \$120.00 tax in the old part of Highgrove and taxed the new homes as much as \$2,967.40 for the same CSA 126 line item.

* Set to approve a retail cannabis store at the same location that was previously opposed by Highgrove residents without any input from the new Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council or notifying the local Highgrove newspaper about the Planning Commission meetings.

Input needed from all Highgrove residents!

Two ballots approved the special tax for our Deputy but no notice was given to the voters when the Highgrove Deputy was eliminated.

If you live in Highgrove east of the I-215 freeway check your property tax bills. The older part of Highgrove is paying \$120.00 but if the amount directly across from CSA 126 on your tax bill is more than \$120.00 you are paying too much. County Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors planning to approve Marijuana Store in Highgrove!

Residents need to be there on Dec. 10, 2019.

There will be a public hearing at 10:00 am on Dec. 10, 2019 on the first floor of the Riverside County Administration Building, located at 4080 Lemon St. in Riverside.

All Highgrove residents are encouraged to attend this meeting, fill out a "Public Comments" card, and voice your opinion about allowing a marijuana business to operate at this location.



This was the former Hughes Appliance store in Highgrove

Press Enterprise on Nov. 24, 2019, the Riverside County Planning Commission is planning to open the first marijuana store in the county in Highgrove at the same location that was opposed by Highgrove residents several years ago.

Several years ago this location was part of Riverside's facade improvement program that improved the frontage of several businesses in Highgrove. The above building used to be the Hughes Appliance Store for many years then it was a second-hand store called Lady Cool Stuff. The last occupant was a marijuana dispensary called Casa Marijuana but due to citizen's complaints they were closed down.

The latest applicants have similar stores in West Hollywood and Los Angeles.

According to an article in the Newspaper has been the only local newswpaper in Highgrove for the last 25 years. The P E article stated: "While no one at Wednesday's Planning Commission spoke against the Artist Tree, the city of Riversidewhose city limits are 1,500 feet from the proposed store-expressed concern in a letter to the county. The city which doesn't allow retail cannabis, worries that the store might attract crime, as well as the prospect of minors getting access to marijuana and 'back door sales' from a lack of proper inventory control"

The previous concerns that were raised about this property were that the small parking lot would require vehicles having to back out onto busy Iowa Ave. when leaving the parking lot. (Go to:www.highgrovehappenings. net "Latest Issue" and look on page 13 of Sept. 2014).

The applicants state they want 20 parking spaces and expect 300 to 400 customers per day that will also include marijuana delivered
