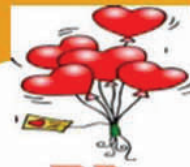

Citrus St. grade crossing improvements on Perris Valley Line



I think these signs were trying to send a message that the road was closed!



The grade crossing at Citrus St. was closed on Nov. 11, 2014.



A new center divider has been added to the middle of the Citrus St. railroad crossing between Northgate/Prospect and the new Iowa Ave. overpass. This railroad grade crossing is part of the improvements on the Perris Valley Line. Center dividers and dual gates are designed to prevent motorists from driving around the gates.

With both lanes in both directions blocked by gates, the only thing to do is wait for the train to pass and the gates to go up. This applies to pedestrians too! The old clickity clack of the railroad track is gone because the



old rail that used to be bolted together will be replaced with new heavier rail that is welded together. There will be no sound of the wheels going over the rail joints because there will not be any joints. The new 131 lb. rail will enable future Metrolink passenger service on the Perris Valley Line between Riverside and Perris. In addition, freight trains will be able to come from Los Angeles, go around the new curve at Highgrove and go right onto the Perris Valley Line instead of going to the San Bernardino freight yard first then returning to Highgrove.

Warehouse fire in Grand Terrace closes freeway



These photos were taken on Nov. 18, 2014 shortly after the warehouse fire that closed the northbound I-215 freeway by the Barton Road exit.



The building was full of delivery and service trucks that were completely destroyed by the extensive heat of the fire. All interior contents were lost.



The freeway was closed because the west wall of the warehouse was leaning toward the freeway and only held together by a few pieces of re-bar at the top. This building is right next to the northbound I-215 freeway and in this photo, it shows that it is about ready to fall. The I-215 freeway was closed for northbound traffic so the west wall of the building could be removed safely.


The cause of the fire is being investigated but the west wall of the building



has been dismantled and the freeway re-opened. The front of the building didn't look too bad from a distance but the inside had extensive damage. If you look closely you can see that the top of the building was melted. This attractive building is on Commerce Way in Grand Terrace and is accessible from Michigan Ave. by the skating rink across from Stater Brothers. It may have not have mattered in this warehouse fire, but when is the last time you checked your smoke detector batteries in your house?

More Apartments on Center St. connected to sewer system



Highgrove's first sewer line down Center St. has seen another residential connection. The Highgrove Blossom Apartments are connected to the sewer system and five apartment units across from the school have also been connected. The sewer line runs from the library, that is also connected, westward down Center St. then turns southward along East La Cadena Dr. and connects to Riverside's sewer system at Palmyrita Avenue.



Steel plates covered the holes shortly after the connection. The pictures of the connections were taken on Nov. 3, 2014 but these connections have since been completed. Other previous sewer connections include the Chevron Service Station at the corner of Center St. and Iowa Avenue.



Workmen dug down with a backhoe on Center St. across from the school to connect the apartments to the main line that runs down Center Street.

At the next Highgrove Municipal advisory Council meeting on Feb. 18, 2015 at the library, our agenda will include information about the cost to connect to the sewer system. The meeting starts at 7:00 pm.

Center St. residents and businesses located along Highgrove's first sewer line from the library to East La Cadena Drive will be able to ask questions about the connections. The new homes in Spring Mountain Ranch also connects to the Riverside sewer system but the Norton Younglove Community Center received special permission to connect to the Colton sewer line that runs down Main Street.

On Jan. 6, 2015 workmen were doing the finishing touches on the north side of Center St. on the N/E corner of Center St. and Mt. Vernon Avenue. There will be 4 new traffic signals on Mt. Vernon Ave: one at Palmyrita Ave., one at Pigeon Pass Road, one at Spring St. and one at Center Street. The model homes are ready for you if you have not already been to see them. Access is from Mt. Vernon Ave. and Pigeon Pass Road. Here is your chance to get a new home and have your choice of lots!



Mt. Vernon Ave. has been widened between Center St. and Spring Street. The Spring Mountain Ranch project will eventually add 1,409 new homes when completed but they will be built in sections. The current builder is KB Homes.

Hit and Run

What makes a person hit and run? There are several basic answers to the question.

Drunk, or impaired driving, unlicensed/un-insured driver, un-registered car, Illegal alien, stolen car, road rage, or un-caring, driver.

These all have one thing in common: They are all Illegal.

A drunk driver doesn't have the good judgment to make a good decision about stopping to swap information, offer assistance, or do the right thing.

Someone driving illegally whether an illegal alien, unlicensed, or uninsured, makes a conscious decision to drive without documentation. A driver of a stolen car is obviously not going to stop, because the only outcome for him/her is jail.

Road rage and immaturity can alter the judgment, especially if there is no thought but to get away. I once had a friend that was married to a woman who was bipolar. I can mention this because my friend has passed away, and his wife no longer lives in the U.S. She was driving on the freeway behind a driver who she judged to be driving too slowly. She whipped around the car, stopped in front of the offending driver, and got out of her car to confront the driver. It is unclear what exactly what happened next, but she ended up jumping up and down on the hood of that car. The police were

called, and when they arrived she wanted the Highway Patrol officer to arrest the driver of that car. Well guess who got arrested?

This is a perfect example of someone who was driving while impaired. In this case she was off of her medication, instead of on drugs or alcohol.

Driving while impaired, road rage, and driving a stolen car, are all very obvious felonies. Serious jail time and/or fines are levied against such drivers.

The most preventable of the hit and run drivers are those driving without a license, the un-insured, and illegal aliens. Some of these people are just thoughtless, and don't want to take the time or responsibility. Some feel they can't afford to buy insurance, or take care of a fine.

Recently the governor signed a bill making driving licenses available to illegal aliens. I believe illegal aliens should not even be in our state, licensed or otherwise. But, it should be the responsibility on these people to get licensed, insured, and registered.

I recently visited the DMV to register a car I bought out of state. I wasn't even asked if I had insurance. So part of the problem is actually enforcing the laws we already have. The last four accidents that our family vehicles have been involved in were uninsured drivers.

California Dreaming

It's February and Valentine's Day will take our thoughts to hearts, flowers and boxes of chocolate (make mine dark, please). We talk of love, plan elaborate romantic nights, and look deep into our dearest one's eyes and promise undying devotion.

When we talk about hearts it's not just about romance. Hearts experience so much more. They feel full of love for our children; feel tender for our parents; break when someone dies; are crushed when someone rejects us; and experience that soaring feeling when the first flush of a new love is upon us. The feelings are deep in the center of our chest, sometimes taking our breath away. Our hearts feel so full they seem to spill over; we talk about our heart exploding in our chest from the depth of emotion. Strength of mind, spirit, and soul is measured by a description of the size of the heart. When someone has determination and spirit we say "he has a lot of heart." If a person is generous, "she has a big heart." To be called a "Grinch" is to be said to be a mean one and your "heart's an empty hole."

The physical strength of the heart is a blessing. It works harder to take you up the hill, run faster, lift more, and keep up with the toddler. It beats faster when you are aroused, when you are frightened, and when you are angry. The heart beat of the embryo is the first real sign of life and it is the last sound we hear when our bodies are done with this earth.

"During an average lifetime, the human heart will beat more than 2.5 billion times. Even at rest, the muscles of the heart work hard—twice as hard as the leg muscles of a person sprinting. The heart pumps about 1 million barrels of blood during an average lifetime—that's enough to fill more than 3 super tankers." *

Hearts can be abused as well. Feeding them high fat, high sugar foods; smoking and not working

them out enough will ruin them prematurely. Alcohol and drugs can cause the heart to beat wrong and sometimes stop mid stride. A "heart attack" is actually the blood vessels of the heart being compromised in some way. The lack of blood flow and resulting loss of oxygen to the muscle is what causes the severe pain. The muscle tissue dies and there is a decrease in the strength of the heart. Too much damage and the heart is permanently compromised. Severe damage and the heart stops--sometimes for good.

Happy HEART day.

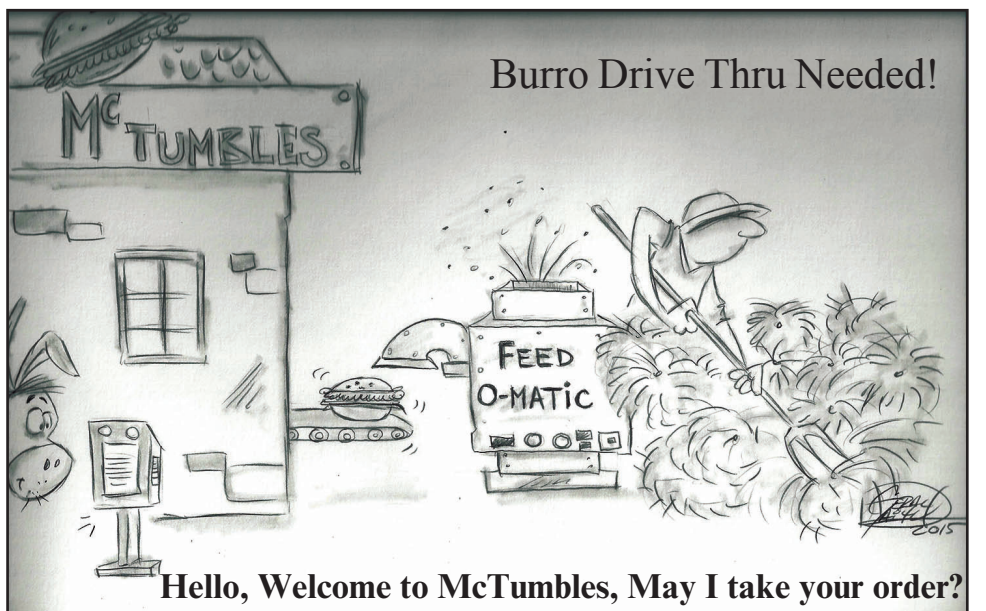

Construction continues on Perris Valley Line



Grading for the curved track to connect the Perris Valley Line to the BNSF main line at Highgrove was underway when this photo was taken on Nov. 2, 2014. The Metrolink train above is shown going through Highgrove between San Bernardino and Riverside. Future Metrolink trains going around the new curve will not stop at Highgrove and neither will the existing train shown above, according to RCTC's plan.



The track on the right is the existing Perris Valley Line track and this is where the future curved track will connect to the Perris Valley Line railroad track. The vegetation on the left is in the Springbrook Arroyo. The old track dates back to the 1800's and will be replaced with new ballast, railroad ties, and heavier rail to allow future Metrolink train service between Riverside and Perris.



Since the new curved track connection is near the Springbrook Arroyo, the banks of the arroyo have been re-inforced with concrete and steel.
