## Attention Spring Mountain Ranch and D. R Horton Homeowners!

Since 1992, Highgrove property owners have been paying \$120.00 extra per year for our own Deputy Sheriff that was assigned exclusively to Highgrove.

Then on Dec. 30, 2009, Riverside County eliminated the Highgrove Deputy's position without notifying the Highgrove property owners but the assessment still continues today.

The old part of Highgrove has been paying the annual

\$120.00 for many years but our new neighbors in the SMR and DR Horton homes are being charged up to \$2,967.40 for the same CSA 126 line item which is Highgrove's special assessment for the Sheriff we no longer have, and Park and Recreation.

On behalf of all Highgrove property owners east of the I-215, I am suing Riverside County to find out where Highgrove's CSA 126 money has gone for the last 9 years <u>after</u> our Deputy Sheriff was eliminated, but I need your input. I have collected several SMR and DRH tax bills showing the improper amounts being collected but I need more!

Check your property tax bill. If your CSA 126 assessment on your property tax bill is more than \$120.00 you should call Riverside County at (866) 810 0255 and request a <u>written</u> response showing where the CSA 126 assessment money is being spent. A verbal explanation over the phone is insufficient. 2018/2019 property tax bill to: highgrovenews@roadrunner. com and include your phone number, and send me a copy of their <u>written</u> reply or their response to your request. ## A short road across this field in Highgrove will connect two cities in two different counties.



The above intersection is at Spring St. and Michigan Ave. in Highgrove looking southward toward the city limits of Riverside.

If Michigan Ave. were to be extended southward across this field and connected to the area between the buildings near Palmyrita Ave. in Riverside, this would make Michigan Ave. a new north/south road all the way from Barton Road in Grand Terrace, through Highgrove, and connect to Columbia Ave. in Riverside.

This vacant land is part of the 183 acre Springbrook Estates property. A new road is needed while this land is still vacant.

### **Comparing Insurance premiums** to the Highgrove Sheriff fee!

There are many kinds of insurance such as life insurance, car insurance, and health insurance, just to name a few.

Insurance is designed for the purchaser to usually pay monthly premiums for an insurance policy that will be there for them when they need help in the future. The provisions in the agreement state that if you continue paying the premiums you will be covered under the terms of the agreement when you file a claim.

But what would you do if you found out that even though you have made the monthly or yearly premiums on time, your insurance company had previously voided your policy and the insurance you thought you had had been cancelled without notifying you? Wouldn't you want a refund for the insurance you paid for but didn't receive?

There are many similarities between insurance premiums that are required to keep your insurance policy current and how the parcel owners of Highgrove are being required to continue making payments with their property taxes after their (Sheriff) was eliminated nine years ago.

None of us would want to learn that the insurance premiums we have paid are still being collected after their insurance company voided our policy, especially if you were not notified.

Highgrove residents feel the same way. We have been paying a parcel assessment of \$120.00 per year per parcel for our own Deputy Sheriff that was eliminated on Dec. 30, 2009.

Tax bills for F/Y 2018/19 in the older part of Highgrove show \$120.00 across from CSA 126 which was supposed to pay for a deputy Sheriff exclusive to Highgrove east of the I-215 freeway and the maintenance of our one 5-acre park.

So if the older residents of Highgrove are still paying \$120.00 per year for CSA 126 nine years after the Sheriff was eliminated, why are the new residents of Highgrove in the Spring Mountain Ranch and D R Homes paying more than \$120.00 per parcel?

Some Spring Mountain Ranch parcels are being charged as much as \$2,967.40 for CSA 126 and I have copies of their tax bills to prove it.

If the Highgrove's Sheriff was eliminated 9 years ago and excessive amounts are being collected from the new Highgrove residents, the question that needs to be answered is:

#### WHERE DID ALL THE **MONEY GO?**

The money should have been "retained" in the CSA 126 account as provided for in the "Impartial Analysis" prior to the 1997 ballot.

#### You Can Quote Me by Cynthia Williams, DC

"My face has not ignored the passage of time but recorded it with scars, lines, and furrows."

~John Steinbeck

"Travels with Charlie- In Search of America"

Boy Howdy, is that the truth. This line from the fabulous book by Steinbeck obviously hit home. Furrows, lines, scars are all over my body. I'm supposed to be proud; they are a badge of battles won, a sign of a life well lived, and I am so sure I will accumulate more.

I'm in the midst of another move. I HATE moving! I doubt anyone likes it. I'm fortunate in that I'm able to start with the little boxes, hanging clothes, and such so I'll have a smaller moving day. The drive is about 20 miles each way so I've been listening to Steinbeck's "Travels with Charlie" to pass the time. I highly recommend this book. The audio is read by the excellent actor Gary Sinise and it is wonderful. Between his reading and Steinbeck's writing, I've thoroughly enjoyed my many trips back and forth. If you can get the audio, enjoy this classic writer this way. (It's available as audio CDs through the Riverside County Library system!)

Moving stirs up a lot of stuff. More that just dirt and dust. You're amazed at the amount of things you accumulate in a short period of time, or even over a decade or two or more. I've been in my current place for nearly two-and-a-half years. And I'm good. Really good. At accumulating stuff. My daughter, an avowed minimalist, calls it all "junk". How dare she! I have decades of memories, years of dreams, and evidence of accomplishments- all in boxes. I have Christmas decorations older than she or her sister. Mom, Dad's, and my high school year books are there for anyone to enjoy. There's decades of history lovingly stored in cardboard. Multiples of memories in frames, and attestations constructed out of wood and marble of my professional successes waiting my next visit.

The common issue we "Baby-Boomers" are facing is our kids don't want our stuff! They see no value in the items we have carefully preserved- monetary or emotional. They have no interest in great-grandmother Edith's wedding silver. Uncle Fred, who fought in WWI and WWII, his uniform and medals hasn't many resting places in the hearts of the younger generation although museums may be interested in certain items. There is a lot of emotion surrounding this issue. Boomers don't want to see it all tossed as trash and the Youngers don't want to have to be the ones to wade through the boxes and deal with it all. What's a Boomer to do?

One suggestion from my daughter: take pictures. Digital photos can be made into lovely albums. This is a viable solution for some things, especially fragile printed photos that are many years old and are degrading. The print methods are far superior than in years past and the durability is desirable. And of course, there will be the digital record as well. With digital photos, they can go to a "cloud" and set up to share with family and friends for years to come. I've talked to many people who don't trust the "cloud". Those fears are nearly 100% unfounded. The being hacked isn't going to happen. First of all, the security in place for cloud servers like Apple or Google is very good. Next, no one cares about your photos. They want Jo-Lo's or Cher's. Not Aunt Cindy in 3rd grade. Your information is extremely safe.

So I am preparing for the inevitable distribution of goods after my demise, which I am not anticipating in the near future, but hey, stuff happens... I have started putting little tags and sticky notes on the bottom of things with a name of to whom it goes. The little frame photo of Momo goes to Mandy, the little photo of Toots to Kristi, etc. I have tagged all my art quilts and made a list. I hope everyone likes the ones I've chosen for them. The bottom line is you can't take your "stuff" with you without some create planning (bon fire and save the ashes to mix with yours?) Work on it a bit at a time and it won't be so overwhelming. You can also have frequent little jaunts down memory lane.

# **Ten Cars of Santa Fe Freight Train Derailed**

The last 10 cars of a Santa Fe Railroad freight train derailed on a curve in Highland Park Sunday, toppling containers of clothing and appliances from flatcars and knocking over power poles as the cars careened alongside the tracks.

No one was injured in the accident, which occurred about 10:30 a.m. near the intersection of north Marmion Way and Avenue 43. Four men were aboard the 56-car train as it headed into Los Angeles on the last leg of a trip from Chicago by way of San Bernardino.
