Follow the path of destruction of southbound vehicle accident on Iowa Ave.!



The southbound vehicle jumped the median on Iowa Ave. just south of the curve past Main Street and



plowed through the vegetation and slid sideways across the northbound lane toward Adam's Barber shop,



then the left front wheel broke off and landed in the bushes of the church.



It then sheared off this concrete light pole at the corner of W. Church St. and Iowa Ave. as it was spinning around throwing the street light and head light onto the church parking lot.



The southbound vehicle then came to a rest headed northward by the northbound lane against the wires that hold up the telephone pole by Adam's Barber shop on the S/E east corner of Iowa Ave. and West Church Street.



CHP Report:

On May 29, 2014 at approximately 1:57 am, Mr. David Jimenez (male 21, Riverside) was driving a 2004 Nissan 350Z on Iowa Ave north of W. Church and collided with a pole. Mr. Jimenez was determined to be under the influence at the time of the collision and was arrested on suspicion of driving under the influence 23152 (a) V.C. This traffic collision is still under investigation.

Highgrove Happenings Report:

An eye witness reported to us that she was watering her lawn at night at the time of the incident and witnessed two cars racing southbound on Iowa Avenue. For this vehicle to travel such a far distance after jumping the median makes me believe that there was a high rate of speed that contributed to this accident.

I held season tickets for the San Diego Chargers for 23 years. I would live and die with their fortunes and misfortunes. I also had season tickets for the Padres for a few years, and I am, from the very beginning, an Angels fan.

Athletes, as all of us are imperfect and subject to all the pressures of celebrity and money. Today

however, I find it hard to relate to many athletes behavior both on and off the field or court.

I think the celebrations when making a touchdown, or basket is the most telling. Sportsmanship and class is almost non-existent in today's football and basketball games.

I recall that many years ago Bum Phillips, the famous Houston Oilers coach, said that we should be recruiting from the streets and ghettos to get tough players. Well his thoughts have become a reality to us all.

Golf is the only sport that still exhibits self-control, and sportsmanship. The game honors those who play in a genteel manner, although I'm very sure bad behavior happens in golf. Tiger Woods however, is the only blatant example of scandal that comes to mind in the 500-year history of the game.

The blame lays squarely on us, the sports fans that shell out, nowadays very large sums of money to attend, view and bet on the games. I also fault the NCAA, and affiliate colleges who look the other way when athletes attend and "graduate" with no skills, while regulating for the sake of window dressing, a player that accepts a gift from enthusiastic alumni.

Yea, I want my favorite team to win. But I want my team to be populated with winners, not incredible losers, with a God given athletic ability.

Women Must Know What to Expect from Social Security

Everyone needs to be aware of the financial resources they will have available in retirement. But if you're a woman, you must be particularly diligent, for a variety of reasons. And that means you'll need to know just what to expect from Social Security. Why should you, as a woman, pay extra attention to Social Security? For one thing, women often take time off from their careers to care for children and older parents, so they may accumulate less money in employer-sponsored retirement accounts, such as 401(k) plans. And women still live several years longer than men, according to the Census Bureau. Clearly, then, you need to get the most you can from Social Security. To do so, you will need to consider at least three key factors:

- **Age** — You can start taking retirement benefits as early as 62, but your benefits may be reduced by up to 30% unless you wait until your "full retirement age," which is likely 66 or 67. If you delay taking benefits until 70, your monthly benefits may be up to a third larger than if you started collecting Social Security at your full retirement age. You'll need to weigh a variety of factors — such as family longevity, income from employer-sponsored retirement plans and your anticipated financial needs — in determining when you should start taking Social Security.
- **Employment** — If you work while receiving Social Security benefits before you reach full retirement age, your benefits will be reduced by \$1 for every \$2 you earn over an annual limit, which generally increases each year. In the year you reach full retirement age, your benefits will be reduced by \$1 for every \$3 you earn over the limit before your birthday. But once you reach full retirement age, your benefits will no longer be adjusted for earned income.
- **Marital status** — As a spouse, you can generally receive Social Security payments based on your own earnings record or collect a spousal benefit of up to 50% of your hus-

band's Social Security benefit. The benefit will be reduced if you start taking it before your full retirement age. To start collecting Social Security spousal benefits, you must be at least 62 years old and your husband must also have filed for his own benefits. If you're divorced, and you're not currently married, you can generally receive benefits on your ex-husband's Social Security record, as long as you meet certain conditions. (For example, you had to have been married to your ex-husband for at least 10 years.)

No matter how much Social Security you ultimately receive, it's almost certainly not going to be enough to provide all the income you'll need. So during your working years, try to contribute as much as you can, for as long as you can, to your IRA and your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. At the same time, look for other investment opportunities. And when you reach retirement, create a withdrawal strategy that allows you to stretch out the income you receive from your investments for as long as you can. By saving and investing as much as possible during your working years, maximizing your Social Security payments and carefully managing your financial assets when you're retired, you can help improve your chances of enjoying the retirement lifestyle you deserve.

Capitol Reef National Park has a lot of beautiful scenery that is visible from highway 24 between Hanksville and Torrey, Utah.



Bryce Canyon National Park is totally different from Zion but both are uniquely beautiful in their own way. If you see one you must see them both since Bryce and Zion are relatively close together! If you are traveling from Highgrove to either place, Zion is closest but we were traveling westward from Iowa to Highgrove so we went through the Arches first then Capitol Reef, Bryce and Zion. The Golden Age pass I bought several years ago gave us free entry into all of the National Parks we visited.



We had to wait on this motor home to get through the tunnel so we could enter Zion National Park. Large motor homes must straddle the center line through the tunnel because they are too large for the opening. Rangers use radios to stop the 2 way traffic when larger vehicles needs to go through the tunnel. We had to do the same thing when we had our motor home and went to Zion several years ago but this time we were with Mark and Lynette in their car and we had to wait to get into the park.

We saw Hayley Rae, our new granddaughter, for the first time! She was born March 28th and Ardie couldn’t resist buying her the sun glasses.



California Dreaming

It's almost Independence Day and our 238th year of celebration is almost underway. We light fireworks, (some dummies shoot their guns in the air), have picnics, sit by the rivers and lakes and celebrate, have fun, and enjoy the summer day.

All the talk of independence invariably gets around to the amendments in the Bill of Rights, created in 1789. There are a few rights in that "Bill" that are thrown around frequently; the focus is usually on the First and the Second Amendments to that Bill of Rights. The right to free speech and the right to bear arms get the most attention and cause the most arguments. They are discussed with passion on the street, in the courts, and across the dinner table. I'm not going to address the Second Amendment- discussing the right to bear arms is a loaded gun- pun totally intended. However, I have the right to discuss the freedom of speech. Amendment I: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or of the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

Our government hasn't made any laws lately inhibiting our freedom of speech but our society is going down a hard road in a reckless direction and I'm sure, an unintended destination. I've seen disturbing and conflicting trends with questionable consequences to those who have knowingly or unwittingly expressed their thoughts and opinions. There is a growing fear of openly expressing one's opinions. The judgment by others and the potential punishment for simply speaking our mind has not been this severe in my lifetime. One can lose a job, a political position or election, be ostracized and even lose property as a consequence of speaking his mind. With over-arching political correctness and reactionary push-back, there seems to be limited discussion of the issue at hand and all the attention is directed toward the person making the "offensive" statement and those whose were offended by said statement.

The beauty of the "Freedom of Speech" is that one is supposed to be allowed to say what is on one's mind unless it creates severe harm to others: cliché: "yelling FIRE in a crowded theater" which could cause panic and physical

Because no matter how offended you are by another's words, there will be another person who is applauding what that person said. And the table can be turned as well. As those who are offended by another person's words and take terrific umbrage and wail and demand punishment for their feelings being hurt, there is a gradual tightening of that sense of freedom. I think we are at cross-roads as a country; we are still evolving and we are having growing pains but I think we are moving backwards. It is a very dangerous slide. Nowadays one has to be brave to freely express their views in the face of very severe potential consequences. Thomas Jefferson believed that minimizing the limits on what people were free to say was critical for a "liberal democracy" to thrive. The Founders also thought that open exchanges of ideas would encourage tolerance among people with opposing views. Of recent that has not been the case. It is important- no, it is essential that we all remember that our right of free speech is contingent another's right to free speech. By limiting another's right you limit your own. It can be tough to hear, tough to swallow, but that is what freedom is about. It's time for people to take a deep breath, turn the other cheek, and learn to agree to disagree.

Seven Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council seats open until July 14, 2014.

Supervisor Tavaglione has decided to review the positions on the Highgrove MAC and make the 7 positions available for existing members to re-apply by re-submitting their applications or to make the positions available to other members who qualify.

The following information shows that MAC members shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age and be a resident, landowner, or business owner within the Highgrove MAC territory.

Purpose:

It shall be the purpose of the Highgrove MAC to advise and recommend proposed action to the Board regarding matters including, but not limited to, public safety, planning, health, transportation, parks, and community development within the unincorporated territory. The MAC shall not represent the community to any state, county, city, special district or school district, agency or commission, or any other organization on any matter unless specifically authorized by the Board to do so.

Department(s) Providing Staff Support:

2nd District, Supervisor John Tavaglione / (951) 955-1020

MEMBER CRITERIA

Composition:

The Highgrove MAC shall consist of five (5) regular members and two (2) alternate members, each of whom shall be appointed by and serve at large at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors. **All appointees shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age and be a resident, landowner, or business owner within the Highgrove MAC territory.**

Tenure/Term of Office:

Appointed members shall serve for a term of two (2) years, except that in order to establish a system of staggered terms, one initial alternate member and two of the regular members initially appointed shall serve until June 30, 2008. The other three regular members and one alternate member initially appointed shall serve until June 30, 2010. Thereafter, all terms shall be for two (2) full years from May 1 of the year appointed to April 30 two (2) years hence.

Officers:

The Highgrove MAC shall choose from among its members a presiding officer, an assistant presiding officer, and a secretary. This shall be done at the first meeting after the creation and appointment of the MCA. Selection of such officers shall be conducted at the first meeting following appointment or reappointment of members each and every year thereafter.

Meetings:

The Highgrove MAC shall determine the frequency of its regular meetings, which shall be at least quarterly. The MAC shall by standing order, fix the time and place of its meetings, which shall be held within the County of Riverside and, normally, within the boundaries of the MAC. The call, giving of notice and conduct of meetings shall be in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (Government Code Section 54950, et seq.).

Compensation:

Appointed members shall serve without compensation.

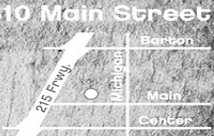
