Distance Between Pot Shops to stay at 1,000 Ft! Highgrove community members wait 7 hours at the **Board of Supervisors meeting to oppose reducing the** distance between Pot shops from 1,000 feet to 250 feet

It was a long day on May 19, 2020 when six Highgrove residents had to sit with their face masks in place during the meeting while waiting for item 21.1 to be brought before the Riverside County Board of Supervisors.

I would personally like to thank Highgrove residents Karen Rich, Art Bernal, Diane Franks, David Amdahl, and Nick Nikpour for going to this meeting. And after waiting for many hours, when our item was about to be discussed, Chairman Perez said that 33 people wanted to speak on this item during public comments and he was going to move items 21.2 an 21.3 ahead of our item and then take a 15 minute break before our item would be discussed. After sitting thru several hours of this meeting, two of our speakers had to leave but their time had already been donated to we entered the meeting. But instead of me having 6 minutes to speak I was cut off at 3 minutes. Chairman Perez said my friends had to be present in order for me to get their 3 minutes, so I was unable to finish my presentation. This seemed unfair since they had already sat thru several hours of this meeting. Then when our next speaker, Nick Nikpour tried to give me his time, he was denied by Chairman Perez.

Two Key words

After many public comments and discussions between Board members, there were two key words that prevented the applicant from getting the ditance between Pot Shops reduced to only 250 feet. Those two Key words were:

"County Wide."

The outside interested parties were trying to use Highgrove as a stepping stone to make the distances between Pot Shops only 250 feet apart in all of Riverside County.

This was not about Highrove at all except that if they were successful, our community could have seen three Pot Shops along Iowa Ave. in Highgrove. Here is a copy of the presentation I was going to make when I got cut off. I am glad that I e-mailed this to each supervisor on the Saturday before this meeting because I was only allowed to read about half of it even though I had time donated from my friends. Here is my presentation:

What is Butane Hash Oil?

Taken from the Alcohol and Drug Foundation web site: What is Butane hash oil?

Dabs or dabbing are the names for the use of concentrated butane hash oil. It is a relative new method of

administrating/ingesting cannabis that involves the inhalation of highly concentrated (THC), the main active chemical in cannabis

Reports suggest that the butane hash oil can have a (THC) concentration of approximately 80% (in comparison with traditional cannabis which is about 10-25%).

It has been reported that the home production BHO (known as blasting) is hazardous as butane is flammable and highly volatile with a number of incidents such as explosions, fires and severe burns occurring in the US.

The fire and explosion in Los Angeles on May 16, 2020 where 12 LA Firemen were injured is under a criminal investigaation and the spokesman for the Fire department, Captain Erick Scott said: "Smoke Tokes *supplied butane honey oil and other materials for cannabis-type operations*" Is this another danger about cannabis that needs more attention? Could an explosion happen at a cannabis store? **Outside interests Vs. Public Comments**

The Advantage goes to the Applicant!

The meetings conducted in Riverside County and other areas are usually held during business hours when most of the general public is working. The applicant for making a change usually has ample time and funding behind them for making a power point presentation with graphics and charts to convince the authorities they should make a decision that would be favorable to them and usually there is no time limit for their presentation. But when it comes time for Public Comments from both the ones who are <u>for</u> a proposal and also those who are <u>against</u> the same proposal, they are given only 3 minutes to say what they want to the authorities making the decision. The authorities are not permitted to ask any questions of the members of the public during their time at the podium or after a member of the public has had their 3 minutes.

Then, after the public comments section is over the applicant can again address the authorities to answer any questions or give explanations on their behalf regarding their proposal

but the public has already had their 3 minutes and no additional public testimony was allowed.

This was very apparent when the applicant was allowed to addresss the Supervisors again just prior to the vote. Supervisor Spiegel said she would have approved it for Highgrove but she didn't want it to apply to <u>all of Riverside County</u>. Supervisors Spiegel, Jeffries, and Washington were able to see through their proposal and they voted to deny the application to reduce the distances. But Supervisors Perez and Hewitt voted to allow the distances to be shortened.

Do public comments serve the public's needs?

During Supervisor Ashley's jurisdiction, developers or builders who wanted to make changes in Highgrove were directed to present their project to the Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council before going directly to the Planning Commission. This process enabled the community to know what is being planned for their neighborhood and it worked very well for many years. We had a voice in our community!

But when Supervisor Tavaglione replaced Supervisor Ashley due to boundary adjustments, Supervisor Tavaglione eliminated the entire Highgrove Advisory Council at a public hearing on April 11, 2017 and for 2 1/2years Highgrove was left without any voice of the Highgrove people to our County Supervisor.

The new Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council under Supervisor Spiegel held their first meeting at the Highgrove Library on October 30, 2019 but the meeting was only to review the Brown Act.

Then on Nov. 20, 2019, the following month after thr first MAC meeting, I learned about a letter from the City of Riverside to Riverside County opposing a marijuana store in Highgrove. So what happened to the Ashley agreement about the Highgrove Municipal Advisory Council being made aware of any new changes to Highgrove? Was the Highgrove community or the Highgrove MAC able to comment on any of these changes?

Supervisor Tavaglione eliminated the first Highgrove MAC and it is apparent that the applicant for the first pot shop went directly to the Planning Commission instead of notifying the Highgrove MAC.

Then it happened again because nothing was mentioned at the second MAC meeting on Jan 29, 2020 about a request for a second marijuana store in Highgrove or changing the ordinance between pot shops from 1,000 feet to 250 feet between marijuana stores.

For the 2nd time, the applicants went directly to the Planning Commission instead of notifying the new Highgrove MAC about the ordinance change because the <u>staff recommendations from the Planning</u> <u>Commission</u> were to approve shortening the distance between stores from 1,000 feet to 250 feet.

Public Asked to Monitor Planning Commission

Looking at the Covid 19 statistics online is enough to scare any person with a sound mind.

Visiting https://www.newsbreak.com/topics/coronavirus?s=web or cdc.gov there are intuitive easy to read numbers showing locations, number of people infected and the number of deaths.

It's amazing when looking at the number of confirmed cases in the US in comparison to confirmed cases globally. Why is the US so high? As of May 13th, 32% of the confirmed cases are right here in the US. This may seem suspicious to some people when you consider the fact that we have excellent means of communication, access to masks, and a large number of precautions being implemented by businesses and other public services. Oh yeah, and the US only comprises about 6% of the world population.

Experts are claiming that "Under-counting deaths in this particular epidemic is happening all over." The question may be, "All over where?" USA Today published a fact check. The claim: Hospitals get paid more if patients are listed as COVID-19, and on ventilators.

Sen. Scott Jensen, R-Minn., a physician in Minnesota posted on his facebook page on April 15th:

"How can anyone not believe that increasing the number of COVID-19 deaths may create an avenue for states to receive a larger portion of federal dollars. Already some states are complaining that they are not getting enough of the CARES Act dollars because they are having significantly more proportional COVID-19 deaths."

On April 19, he doubled down on his assertion via video on his Facebook page.

Jensen said, "Hospital administrators might well want to see COVID-19 attached to a discharge summary or a death certificate. Why? Because if it's a straightforward, garden-variety pneumonia that a person is admitted to the hospital for – if they're Medicare – typically, the diagnosis-related group lump sum payment would be \$5,000. But if it's COVID-19 pneumonia, then it's \$13,000, and if that COVID-19 pneumonia patient ends up on a ventilator, it goes up to \$39,000."

Who are the members of the new Highgrove MAC?

It is encouraging to see that men are realizing that parenting is a genuine partnership and they *want* to be involved. This Father's Day will be sadder as my nephews Brian and Cole and niece Ashley lost their father in January. Brad left us too soonhe was only 56. I know the struggle of trying to get through the milestones of the first year of loss. I have three brothers still- Dana, Mark, and Cory. They are all dedicated, devoted and loving dads. My dad would be proud of the fathers they became.

My dad was a wonderful father. We lost him too soon and I still miss him dearly. I wish I could give him his favorite box of See's Victorian Toffee candy. That would be perfect. If your dad is still around, hopefully you have good memories of your times with him and will thank him for that. If they times weren't good, try to have some forgiveness in your heart, for your own sake. If he's gone, send a message of love up to him, tell him you miss him and still love him.
