Highgrove Elementary School is now open



Riverside Unified School District Measure O funds that were approved in November 2016 and involved 2 components: the construction of a new 2 story building with 12 classrooms and the renovation of the existing classrooms with new flooring, paint, lighting, roofing and replacing air conditioning. HIGHGROVE HAPPENINGS When Trains Block Center St. and Main St.: Spring St. **Extension Would Allow Access to Iowa Ave. Overpass**



This is the west end of Spring St. where Spring St. ends at Transit Avenue.

Spring St. could be extended westward from this point into the 17 acre location that is already owned by the Riverside County Transportation Commission.



This is a view looking eastward from RCTC's vacant field toward Transit Avenue. The arrow shows where the Spring St. extension would begin and proceed westward through this vacant field next to the telephone poles then turn toward Citrus Ave. and connect to the paved road shown below. This road was built in 2008 and has been blocked off for 13 years.







This old photo states 11 years but Metrolink trains have gone thru Highgrove 7 days a week for 15 years since July 15, 2006. This is near the base of the Iowa Ave. overpass.

In 2009, the Riverside County Transportation Commission paid \$8,625,000.00 for 17 acres so a curved RR track could connect the Perris Valley line trains to the BNSF main line. But RCTC only needed 38 % of this land for the curved track. This amounts to \$3,277,500 but the remaining 62 % or **\$5,347,500** of this field still remains unusable and RCTC has labeled this portion an "Uneconomic Remnant". (See www. highgrovehappenings.net,, "Uneconomic Remnant") RCTC already has over \$5 million invested in their vacant 17 acre field that is just growing weeds but for over 20 years RCTC has opposed using this vacant land for a Metrolink station. Today, Highgrove has thousands of new residents and an extention of Spring St. is needed through RCTC's vacant field so vehicles can get to the Iowa Ave. overpass. The remaining property is needed for a parking lot so commuters could use the existing Metrolink trains that pass through Highgrove 7 days a week between San Bernardino and Oceanside. For 20 years of written support for a Metrolink Station at Highgrove go to: **www.highgrovehappenings.net** and click on Metrolink, the You Tube Video made on Feb.11, 2009, a concept map, Supporting Docs, Station costs, and others. If you are tired of being blocked at Center St. by long freight trains or if you want to take your family to the beach on the train, ask your Highgrove MAC and Supervisor Spiegel to encourage RCTC to extend Spring St. through their property and build a Metrolink station on property they already own. Building vehicle crossings over the existing branch line tracks could be done a lot sooner and a lot cheaper than waiting for an overpass or underpass to be built on Center Street.

This un-used road leads to the base of the Iowa overpass that could be used when trains block Center Street. Pipe barriers were installed right after RCTC's road to nowhere was built.















The top two pictures show water trucks in action. This location is where the field office building was located during the construction of Spring Mountain Ranch and was fairly level ground but the dirt west of Mt. Vernon Ave. is being dug out and will be moved to fill the west end to make the lots level. The other photos show the difference in elevation between the existing level of Spring St. and Mt. Vernon Ave. compared to where the new homes will be located.

A child of an American Air Force member and a Thai-Chinese mother, she was born in Thailand in 1968.

allowed on combat missions. She excelled in flight school and passed as a top student to become a Black Hawk helicopter pilot. She loved the job and her service in the National Guard. She was a respected leader of her troops and the military was an excellent fit for her.

Like the rest of the world, 9-11 changed everything for her. Her guard unit was activated and sent to Iraq. She and her crew didn't fly combat missions but were armed for ground support. On a flight in 2004, her helicopter was fired on by Iraqi insurgents and hit by an RPG (rocket-propelled grenade). It came up through the bubble at her feet and exited over her head in the cockpit. The path of the RPG was devastating to her body. Her right leg was "vaporized" to the hip, the left leg lost just below the knee, and her right arm severely damaged. As her helicopter is going down she was desperately trying to control it to find a clear landing site. Due to the massive shock she was in she didn't realize at the time that her legs were gone so she

couldn't control the foot pedals and that her copilot had the controls. The recounting of the "shoot-down" (NEVER a "crash") is breathtaking to read. Her crew thought she had to be dead and they drug her body across the dirt to another helicopter, the "never leave a man behind" philosophy driving them. Several other members of the crew that day suffered injuries from the RPG but none as severe as hers.

She was in Walter Reed Army Hospital within hours of her injury. The care there absolutely saved her life and gave her hope for recovery. She fought hard, suffering daily through agonizing debridement surgeries for her wounds, skin grafts, surgeries to her arm to put in many plates, screws, and bolts to try to save it. At one point her arm was surgically attached to her abdomen to get new tissue and muscle for rebuilding her arm. The care there was truly groundbreaking and remarkable. Tammy knew she couldn't overcome the total devastation to her body unless she acknowledged the loss and injuries head "OWN THE SUCK" on.



became the motto she lived by while she was recovering. She shared that philosophy with her troops.

A Major at the time, she became the highest ranking officer in the rehabilitation unit and a leader among the other recovering soldiers. She was a strong, vocal advocate for injured warriors and their families. This was the start of the focus of her life of advocacy and assistance to all military members and their families. Despite her grievous injuries, she obtained a medical waiver so she could continue to serve in the Illinois Army National Guard, retiring in 2014 as a Lt. Colonel. She is tremendously proud of her military service to the United States.

In 2012 she was elected the US House to of Representatives for Illinois. Her continued goal of serving and advocating for military members lead her to run for US Senate in 2016.

Her election to Congress gave her a list of "firsts": first Thai American woman, first person born in Thailand, first woman with a disability, the first female double amputee, and the first senator to give birth while in office. She acknowledges these "firsts" but she doesn't allow them to define her or her work. She continues to tirelessly serve and advocate for the military.

husband, Her Bryan Bowlsbey, she whom married in 1993, was her strongest advocate during her recovery, during her campaigns and now during her service to Congress. With their two little daughters, they are a formatable team in Washington, DC. Her book is a facinating look into what drove this woman to recover from her service related injuries.and to continue to serve her country.

HIGHGROVE HAPPENINGS The Last Packing House in Highgrove is Still Working!





These pictures were taken on April 23, 2021 at the last packing house in Highgrove. Highgrove used to have several packing houses but the one on Center St. was formerly called the Brown Estate Packing house. The Brown Estate family owned many acres of orange groves and grapefruit groves that is now covered with new homes in Spring Mountain Ranch. Today the packing is done by machines but the Highgrove Video/Song shows a black and white photo of workers planting the orange groves back in 1887 and another black and white photo of workers sitting at a table during their break and Center St. when it was just dirt.

There is also a colored video of some of the last workers who were grading the oranges by hand. There are two Highgrove videos. the Original Highgrove Song and the Highgrove Revitalization Team video made by the Riverside County Economic Development Agency.
