## GRAND JURY RECOMMENDA-TIONS READ TO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

On October 16, 2018 I attended the Riverside County Board of Supervisors meeting and spoke during public comments. During this time, I wanted to make sure that the existing Supervisors understood that the Grand Jury has recommended that changes should be made to give more transparency to where Highgrove's CSA 126 funds have gone. On Nov. 6, 2018 the elections will determine who the two new Supervisors will be that take office after the first of next year. It is important that this recommendation is followed now during the current Supervisors tenure because two new Supervisors will also need to be aware and follow the Grand Jury recommendation starting in 2019. I also requested and paid for a copy of the statements I made on Oct. 16, 2018. Here is a copy of the Grand Jury's recommendations that I read to the Board of Supervisors:

Recommendations from Grand Jury to Riverside County Board of Supervisors and Riverside County Economic Development Agency: "CSA 126 Communication

CSA 126 management provide a one-time public notice clarifying exactly how the CSA 126 funds are distributed. This notice should include the number of assessed parcels, the amount per parcel for different housing areas, and any current agreements and contracts in effect. At least once every 2 years, CSA management should make a summary report available online and at a public meeting open to all interested Highgrove residents. This effort is appropriate and necessary since there is no current form to discuss such issues in the Highgrove Community. Part of the summary of contracts and agreements should explain the effective date and cost of the current chain of agreements between the CSA 126 management and the Jurupa Valley Sheriff Station for focused law enforcement coverage."

## COURT ASKS HIGHGROVE ATTORNEY TO SUBMIT AMENDED COMPLAINT

At the "Demurrer" hearing on October 22, 2018, Riverside County Superior Court Judge Daniel Ottolia asked our Highgrove Attorney, Michael Geller, to amend the complaint in the Barnett Vs. Riverside County proceedings. The lawsuit is about Highgrove property owners east of the I-215 freeway still having to pay for a Sheriff Deputy that was exclusive to the small community of Highgrove even though the Deputy's position was eliminated on Dec. 30, 2009.

The statements made by the Defense Attorney for Riverside County were difficult to hear but I heard him mention the word "Tort", so I looked up Tort when I got home and the definition of Tort is explained as follows:

"Tort law refers to a set of laws that provide remedies to individuals who have suffered harm by the unreasonable acts of another. Tort law is based on the idea that people are liable for the consequences of their actions, whether intentional or accidental, if they cause harm to another person or entity."

After a short discussion, the judge gave our Highgrove Attorney 30 days to amend the complaint and re-submit it in another form.

I would like to thank Haroldine Swing, John Shively, and Steve Orman for attending the court proceedings. Russell Bleich also attended but was late and missed the short hearing. Afterword Russell came to my house and donated \$100.00 toward helping Highgrove rectify this injustice. Russell's un-solicited donation is unusual because Russell lives on the west side of the freeway and the annual assessment of \$120.00 does not apply to parcels on the west side.

In addition, Russell told me that he is moving out of the state but he has been following the articles in the Highgrove Happenings and before he leaves he wanted to support what I am trying to do for the residents on the east side of Highgrove's CSA 126.

Thank you Russell for your support because it would have been much easier to just move away since you and other residents on the west side of CSA 126 never paid the \$120.00 special assessment. When Highgrove's Deputy started, the property owners on the west side did not want to pay the \$10.00 per month so the Highgrove deputy's area to patrol was only on the east side of the I-215 freeway. Russel said he will follow the articles in the Highgrove Happenings from his computer when he gets to South Carolina.

## Attention Spring Mountain Ranch and D. R Horton homeowners:

Since 1992 Highgrove property owners have been paying \$120.00 extra per year for our own Deputy Sheriff.

But Highgrove's Deputy was eliminated by Riverside County on Dec. 30, 2009 without notifying the Highgrove property owners and the assessment still continues today.

The old part of Highgrove has been paying the annual \$120.00 for many years but our new neighbors in the SMR and DR Horton homes are being charged up to \$2,967.40 for CSA 126 which is Highgrove's special assessment for the Sheriff we no longer have, and Park and Recreation.

I have collected several SMR and DRH tax bills showing the improper amounts being collected but I need more. Please send your current 2018/2019 property tax bill to: highgrovenews@roadrunner.com and call the number on your tax bill across from CSA 126 and ask Riverside County for a written detailed breakdown of where the CSA 126 assessment money is being spent by the county.

The number on your tax bill is: (866) 810 0255.

I am suing Riverside County on behalf of all Highgrove property owners east of the I-215 to find out where Highgrove's CSA 126 money has gone for the last 9 years and I need your input.

If your CSA 126 assessment on your property tax bill is more than \$120.00 you should, call the county (866) 810 0255, and ask for a <u>written</u> response showing where the CSA 126 assessment money is being spent, send me a copy of their <u>written</u> reply, and e-mail a copy of your property tax bill to me. Please include your Phone number.




## 40th year celebration of Grand Terrace celebrated during rainy weather







## **Riverside County Administration Building**

It has been 20 years since the shooting took place at the Riverside City Hall on Oct. 6, 1998. Mayor Loveridge and 4 city council members were shot but their injuries were not life threatening.

Sheriff Deputy, John Stahley was also grazed by a bullet during this event and you may know that years later John became a member of our band the Highgrove Barnstormers.

There is a great deal of difference between entering Riverside's City Hall compared to entering the Riverside County Administration building.

When you enter City Hall you have to have your driver's license scanned and your picture taken that you stick on your shirt and then you tell the attendant what floors you want to visit and you are given a card you can use in the elevator to access the floor you want. What is very apparent in this security system is that the visitor does not have to go through a metal detector.

This seems unusual to me because of what happened 20 years ago at city hall because this time-consuming system does not stop someone with a weapon from entering other floors.

But when you enter the Riverside County Administration building all that is required is you have to empty your pockets and go through a metal detector just like you do at the airport.


