

Her previous employers are the Congress of the United States and the Riverside County Board of Supervisors. She has also served two terms on the Riverside Transit Agency Board of Directors, is a past Chair of the United Way of Greater Riverside and Relay for Life in the San Gorgonio Pass, and supports a number of charitable causes. Grand Terrace Stater Brothers Groundbreaking



On Oct. 21, 2010 Ardie and I attended the ground breaking ceremony for the new Stater Bros. Market in Grand Terrace. The event was attended by Jack Brown, CEO of Stater Bros. and many other Stater Bros. dignitaries, members of Grand Terrace and the surrounding communities and the Mayor of Grand Terrace, Maryetta Ferre, city council members (and candidates).

The new store will be 70% larger than the existing store and will be 45,000 sq. ft. with wider aisles, a fresh meat and seafood dept., delicatessen, bakery, flower dept., produce dept., pharmacy and a Chase Bank located inside. There will be 60% more parking than the other store and a carpool parking area that will accommodate 45 vehicles for Park and Ride participants and an area large enough for a pick up or trailer.

For 28 years Stater Bros. had their headquarters on Barton Road between the railroad track and La Cadena Drive. Jack Brown said "This store brings us back to Grand Terrace and will be the best shopping trip in Southern California!"

The new store will have skylights and require 30% less energy and there will be a recycle center inside the store to recycle paper and plastic grocery bags. Their paper bags are made from 100% recycled bags.

Stater Bros. was founded in 1936 in Yucaipa and is the largest privately owned Supermarket in Southern California and the largest private employer in both San Bernardino County and Riverside County. The company currently operates 167 Supermarkets with over 18,000 members in the Stater Bros. family and they will celebrate their 75th year in 2011. The Stater Bros. Towne Center and related businesses is projected to bring 200 jobs to the new location.

Jack Brown told us that the Highgrove area was also considered as a location for a market but the delay in the construction of the Spring Mountain Ranch homes had an influence on the store location.

AUTO CLUB, RIVERSIDE POLICE, NICB AND CHP OFFER TOP TIPS TO PREVENT VEHICLE BURGLARYAND CAR THEFT

(RIVERSIDE, Nov. 17, 2010) - The Automobile Club of Southern California, the CHP's Inland Division, the Riverside Police Dept. and the NICB offer several tips to prevent vehicle burglary and theft:

- Always lock your vehicle with the windows completely closed.
- Never leave valuables inside the car, especially not in clear view, including small electronics, wallets, check books, credit cards, personal paperwork or any personal identification.
- Bring your electronics and personal items into your home or office whenever possible.
- Use anti-theft or automatic tracking devices. If your vehicle wasn't equipped with an alarm or hidden tracking device when purchased, have one installed.
- Consider adding visible or audible alarms, steering wheel locks, wheel locks and window etching.
- Never leave your keys in your vehicle, even at a gas station.
- Park in a well-lit area at night. Don't leave your vehicle in a highcrime area.
- Never hide a spare ignition key. Remove keys from under floor mats, sun visor, etc.
- Whenever possible, park your vehicle in a secure garage.
- Never leave the vehicle running at any time when you're not in it. This includes your driveway, while picking up friends, or while at a gas station, grocery store, or shopping mall.





We wish Tom and Brenda the very best and a long and happy life together.





There is no swimming, personal watercraft, water skiing, float tubes or body contact of any kind.

Pets are not allowed on trails, shoreline or on boats and smoking is only allowed in designated areas and alcohol is not permitted at the marina including the shoreline. Type B fire extinguishers are required on boats where a fire hazard could be expected from the motors or the fuel system

So what can you do at this lake? Kayaks are allowed but must be at least 10 feet in length and have a current DVL inspection sticker and allow seating for all passengers inside the boat. Boat launching and landing is allowed only at designated docks and ramps and a fishing license is required for all anglers over 16 years old. 

Is Highgrove ready for the future?

Whether we like it or not changes are coming to our area! **NORTH** of us in Grand Terrace there is a new high school being built and construction of a new Stater Bros. Market will begin soon. **SOUTH** of Highgrove there are so many W warehouses up and down Palmyrita Ave. and Columbia Ave. that you may have wondered why they keep building warehouses when so many are "Available", "For Lease" or "For Sale". EAST of Highgrove is the Spring Mountain Ranch



project that will bring hundreds of new houses to our area when completed. This has not happened for several years but millions of dollars have already been invested in infrastructure to make this project "builder ready". This project only needs to have the tumble weeds scraped off of the pads to start building homes. Everything else is ready! Will this ever happen? Will Highgrove be ready when the construction actually begins? Other future plans east of Highgrove include the possibility of a new road to connect Moreno Valley to Highgrove from the top of Pigeon Pass to Main St. or possibly Center Street. These projects are based on the economy which may not happen until the economy improves. But you can bet that they are not going to re-grade everything and plant orange trees!

Near the **WEST** side of Highgrove is the I-215 freeway that has portions on the west side of the freeway that are still in Highgrove. Just a couple of miles south of the Center St. off ramp toward Riverside is the \$381 million dollar I-91/I-215/I-60 interchange and about 5 miles north of Center St. is the I-215/I-10 interchange. Highgrove is ideal for future growth! We have the vacant land and the location, location, location!

Yes changes are happening in all directions including the proposed construction RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE of Highgrove with the Bixby Land Co. owning 40 acres of vacant land just west of the school between Center St. and Spring Street. They also own another 27 acres south of their 40 acres on the south side of Spring Street. Is Highgrove ready to have more warehouses built right in the middle of our community between these residential districts? These 2 large areas of 67 acres also used to be orange groves but have been re-zoned for an Industrial Park and Manufacturing.

Do you think this is a good plan for this vacant land or is there a better use? Please let us know what you think should be in middle of Highgrove.

BLUE MOUNTAIN PARK



Blue Mountain is in private ownership except for 20 acres owned by the City of grand Terrace and some property at the top owned by Riverside County for a communications tower.

The Friends of Blue Mountain envision a 500 acre wilderness park like the 2,000 acre Box Springs Reserve that includes Sugarloaf. People from Highgrove, Grand Terrace, Colton, Riverside, Redlands and other communities make up the Friends of Blue Mountain. The Highgrove part would include a trail to the Colton Part and a historic box spring that may be the one cited in Jane Gunther's book Riverside County Place, Names and their Origins and their stories under "Pigeon Pass" page 389:

It (Pigeon Pass) provided a trail or primitive road as early as May, 1853, when U. S. Deputy Surveyor Henry Hancock noticed "a very clever watering place in a small canyon....on the trail from Jurupa to San Jacinto.

Tesla electric sports car



On Nov. 6, 2010, I have a reservation to test drive an electric sports car called the Tesla that will be at the Riverside International Automotive Museum located at the end of Marlborough Ave. at 815 Marlborough Ave. Suite 200. This electric sports car can go from 0 to 60 MPH in 3.7 seconds. How am I supposed to step on the gas if this car uses no gas? 





BUS TECHNOLOGY TO REDUCE EMISSIONS AND COSTS

Hydraulic hybrid technology relies on energy created by braking to propel the vehicle

The Riverside Transit Agency (RTA) plans to unveil a new type of bus technology next month that could usher in a new generation of cleaner-burning vehicles for the fleet.

The Agency's latest push for new bus technology has resulted in a hydraulic hybrid system aboard a 12-seat vehicle. Energy is harnessed during the braking process, and used to propel the vehicle when it needs to accelerate, resulting in less brake maintenance and reduced operating costs. Plus, better fuel economy means less harmful emissions.

The hydraulic hybrid system offers great advantages for buses that operate in stop and go conditions because the system can capture large amounts of energy when the brakes are applied. "RTA is proud to be a long-time proponent of cleaner, greener technologies in public transit," said RTA Chairman of the Board Jeff Comerchero. "This is another example how we are exploring new and innovative ways to travel."

RTA began work in earnest last spring, following nearly three years of developing the project with hydraulic giant Eaton Corporation, which chose RTA to install and test their new technology. After a short stint at UC Riverside, where students will compare current emissions levels with those done prior to the modifications, the hybrid bus is expected to hit the streets in early November.

This isn't the first time RTA has pushed the boundaries of bus technology. Two years ago, RTA launched two pilot programs designed to reduce vehicle fuel consumption, cut emissions and improve bus engine performance. The success of those pilot programs has prompted RTA to consider the same technology for buses purchased in the future.

In 1988, prior to today's laws that regulate bus emissions, RTA was among the first transit systems in the nation to operate low-emission methanol buses. In fact, when RTA's Riverside headquarters was built in 1986, it included a separate fueling system for alternative clean fuels. The drive for cleaner fuel didn't stop there. In 2001, the agency took its biggest step by replacing its entire fleet of diesel buses with compressed natural gas (CNG) buses.

The Riverside Transit Agency provides public transportation for Western Riverside County, operating 37 fixed routes, 8 express routes and Dial-A-Ride service. RTA's service area spans 2,500 square miles, the second largest in the nation. 

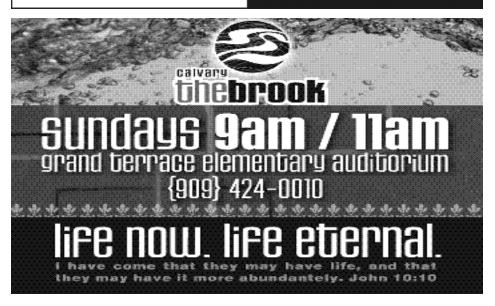


